1. What company manufactured the **tubular bells**? Harrington's

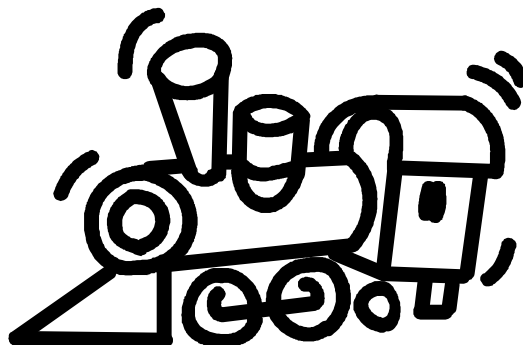
Look at the Bell on level 1:



2. The Bell on level 1 is the oldest bell in Australia but where in the United Kingdom does it come from originally? Upton Grey, Hampshire

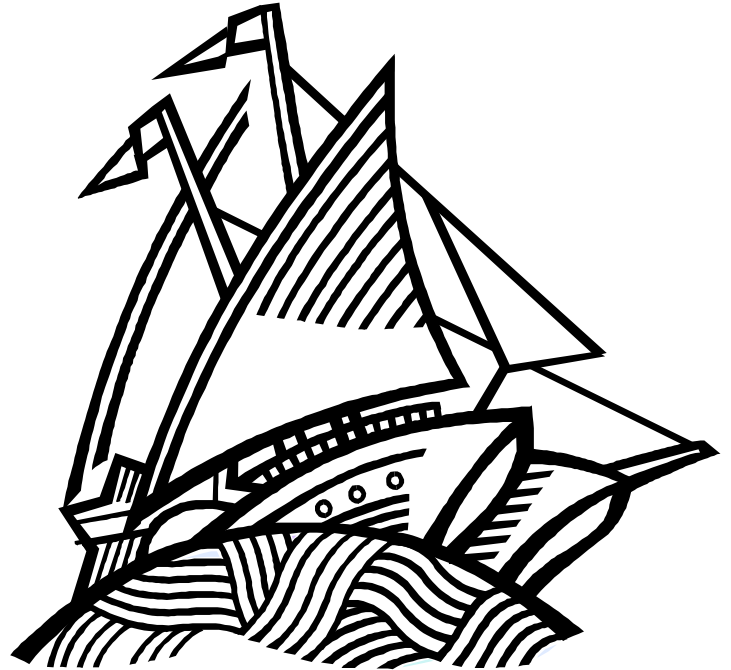
Look through the information panels on level 2:

3. The 12 oldest of these bells come from which London church? Church of St Martin's in the Fields
4. By the 1840's, how many jetties were serving the river trade at Perth? 4
5. In what year was the railway between Fremantle and Guildford completed, shifting the transport focus away from the river? 1881



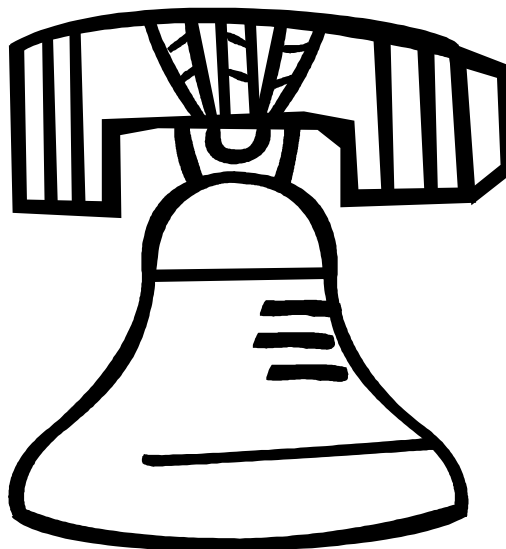
Go to the ship's bells display on level 2:

6. In what year was the barque *Hero of the Nile* shipwrecked off the WA coast? 1876
7. How many people made it ashore from the sinking *Hero of the Nile*? All 13 crew, 2 passengers and Master (Captain); a total of 16

8. How heavy is "Zacchariah"? 1480kg
9. Who is this bell named after? Rev. Zacchariah Pierce, the Vicar of St Martin's in 1725
10. How much does the Treble Bell weigh? 241kg
