

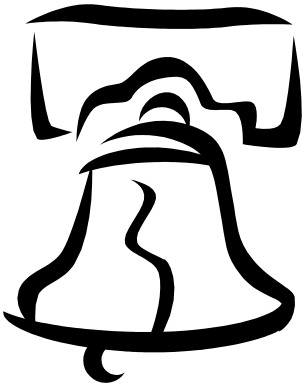


Look around the Swan Bells for the answers to these questions. How many can you find?

2. What company manufactured the tubular bells? The Harrington Company

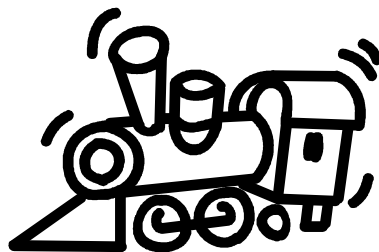
Look at the display on level 1:

6. By the 1840's, how many jetties were serving the river trade at Perth? 4
7. In what year was the railway between Fremantle and Guildford completed, shifting the transport focus away from the river? 1881

8. The Sun Clock on display on level 2 was invented by William Cooke in 1907. What was his position at the Perth Observatory from 1896 to 1912? Government Astronomer



9. In what year was the **barque** *Hero of the Nile* shipwrecked off the WA coast? 1876
10. What is the name of the famous author whose novel *The Mirror of the Sea* was centred on the voyages of the iron barque *Highland Forest*? Joseph Conrad
